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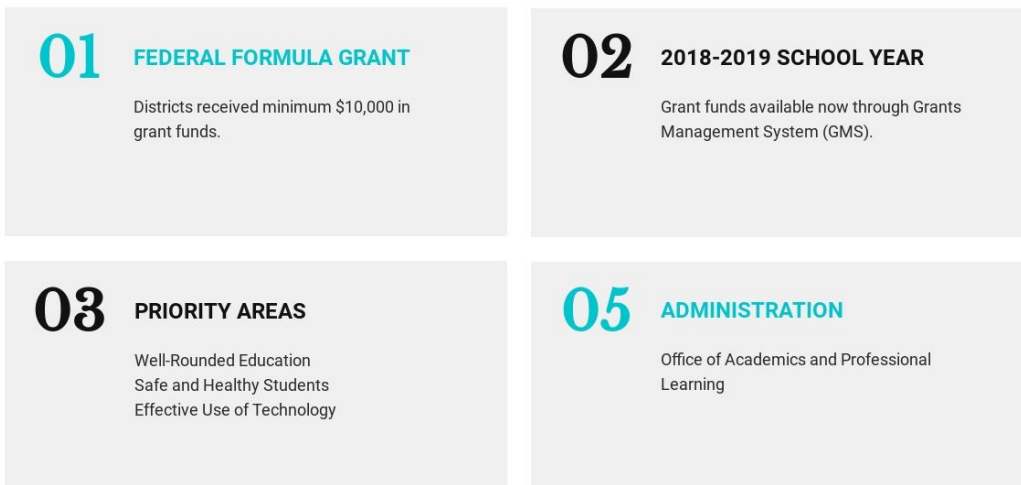

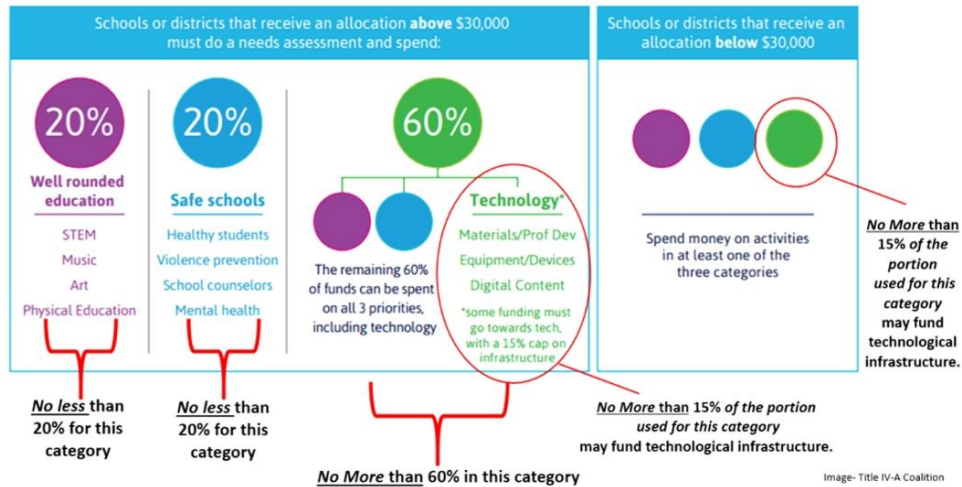

Improving access to foreign language instruction, arts, and music education	Promoting community and parent involvement in schools	Supporting high-quality professional development for educators, school leaders, and administrators to personalize learning and improve academic achievement
Supporting college and career counseling, including providing information on opportunities for financial aid through the early FAFSA	Providing school-based mental health services and counseling	Building technological capacity and infrastructure
Providing programming to improve instruction and student engagement in STEM, and increasing access to these subjects for underrepresented groups	Promoting supportive school climates to reduce the use of exclusionary discipline and promoting supportive school discipline	Carrying out innovative blended learning projects
