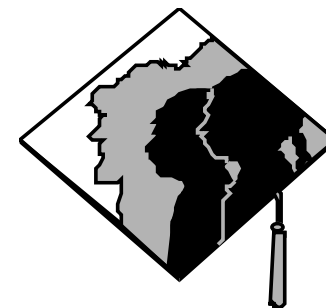

In August 2018, New Hampshire adopted a new law (known as HB 1612, and now codified as RSA 189:66, V) that legally mandates information security for every school district. Additionally, the draft standards recently promulgated by the Department of Education are rigorous. The statute and draft standards require all school districts to conduct a comprehensive information security risk management process designed to protect the sensitive personal information we all have about our students, parents, alumni, and employees, in both electronic and hard copy formats. Complying with the new law will require a full team that includes superintendents, principals, and business managers across your districts and schools – not just IT personnel – and also will almost certainly necessitate school districts retaining an outside information security professional. The deadline to finish the first phase of this process and then submit a governance plan to the State school board is June 30, 2019, so districts need to be doing this work now. McLane Middleton’s Information Privacy and Security Group will inform us about the cyber threats that we face as school districts, explain the legal requirements under RSA 189:66 and the Department of Education’s draft standards, and teach us the practical process for school districts to comply with the new law and satisfy our June 30, 2019 filing deadline.
